Buddy Hall ran the most complete racks from the break in succession (four). He also ran the most balls (37).

"THE PEARL" WINS HIS FIRST OF '85

The field as expected was filled with champions. It is usually difficult to fill the field at a major tournament, but the Ohio State Open cut off at 64 and had a waiting list. Joe Burns added \$5,000 to the purse and enlisted Joe Kerr as tournament director. An Accu-Stats' crew of ten "sweat the matches" and gathered statistics for five days.

The tournament room contained six Gold Crowns with bleachers on three sides of the room. The playing conditions were excellent but the Gold Crowns were unforgiving. Apparently, no one told Earl Strickland. He played with the style and grace that makes a veteran stare in awe. It seemed that he was neither afraid of anyone nor any situation. He outclassed the entire field, played with the most confidence, and it soon became apparent that any loss by Earl would be considered a major upset. Earl eventually won the tournament undefeated.

As with all tourneys, there were upsets, wire matches, and shutouts. There were new names in the money and some improved players who almost won their first major. Let's look at some notable matches:

The biggest upset of the tournament was Larry York over Kim Davenport. In the race to 11, Kim was leading 10-5 only to lose 10-11.

A come-from-behind match was Bobby Johnson losing 6-10 to Ken McCoy and then won five straight to win the set. McCoy missed an easy shot at 10-10 to lose it.

Rick Garrison surprised a few veterans by defeating Vickery, Hall, and Sigel!

Buddy Hall scored the highest Total Performance Average of .973 against Dr. G.R. Bergeson.

At 10-10 Pat Schumacher made the 9-ball on the break against Bob Hunter.

The longest rack was between Jimmy Hodges and Bobby Johnson. An assort-ment of safeties and kicks kept this rack going for 19 turns at the table before Hodges won.

One of the longest racks was between Toby Sweet and Wally Schmidt. After nine turns by Schmidt and eight by Sweet, Sweet won via the three scratch rule. Only two balls were pocketed during the entire rack!

If you reviewed any of the scores on the previous pages, you probably noticed a number in parentheses to the right of each score. It was called the Accu-Stats Average. How is the TPA calculated?

The TPA formula is total balls pocketed divided by (total balls pocketed plus errors). After scoring a match the total of misses, scratches on the break, bad kicks, bad safeties, and bad position are added to the total balls pocketed. This figure divides into the total balls pocketed. For instance, a player pockets 60 balls and makes 15 errors. Divide 75 into 60 to compute the average of .800.









PERFORMANCE BESTS

"Performance Bests" credits players for achievments in many statistical catagories. Too often a player's performance is overlooked by not finishing "in the money". As you will see, there are many "stars" that are proficient in a variety of skills.

TOTAL PERFORMANCE
