



Reyes Cops Coors Tar Heel Open



R O C K Y M O U N T - Filipino Efren Reyes emerged victorious at The 2nd Annual Coors Tar Heel Open posting a 10-1 record and an .888 TPA. After suffering an early round loss to Mike Cone, 8-11, Reyes won the next nine sessions for the \$4,650 first prize. In races to eleven Reyes displayed his prowess by defeating Hopkins (8), Crane (5), Pergerson (2), Root (3), Williams (5), Davenport (4), Mathews (5), Sigel (9), and Strickland twice (9) and (9).

Efren Scales Rocky Mount

Efren Reyes, the twenty-eight year old Philippine phenom, won his second major 9-ball tournament of the year as pooldom's finest succumbed to a foreign style. Without question, Reyes' talent is at least equal to America's finest pocket billiard stars and may even be better.

After a second round loss to local talent Mike Cone, 8-11, Reyes held his next six opponents to five games or less, winning a total of nine sessions in a row for a 10-1 record.

His talents were surly tested as he displayed extraordinary shot making, position, kick, and safety skills while defeating Hopkins, Crane, Sigel, and Strickland twice. In fact, the only thing that he did not display was emotion.

"Mutt" hosts 2nd Event

Dot's Cue Club hosted The 2nd Annual Coors Tar Heel

9-Ball Open with Coors Beer as a major sponsor. \$6,300 was added to the entrance fees for a total purse of \$14,000. Grady Mathews manned the microphone throughout the event while Tony Davis directed and "Mutt" Faulkner played host.

The race to eleven, double elimination event used rules very similar to the PBA with the exception of call shot. Times of the matches were posted well in advance so players and spectators knew who was playing when.

As last year, seating was limited and many sessions were sold out. Standing room only was the rule not only in the tournament room but also in the open pool area, bar, and snack area.

A Spot Shot contest composed of local dignitaries and professional players preceded the main event. It

Notable Matches

The following "Notable Matches" are from the Coors Tar Heel 9-Ball Open. The number in parentheses is the player's TPA for that session.

After taking the lead 10-6, Charlie Brinson (.770) failed to close the door on Howard Vickery (.811). Three unsuccessful opportunities later, Brinson fell victim to Vickery 10-11.

Scott Kitto (.876) continues to play excellent pool but something always seems to happen. While leading Wade Crane (.897) 9-7, Kitto missed. Good night! Crane ran out that rack, then broke and ran out the next three to win 11-9.

Local talent Mike Cone (.855) surprised a few pool detectives by upsetting Efren Reyes (.867) 11-8. After jumping to a 6-1 lead, Cone fell behind 6-7. Cone continued to play tough and garnered the fruits of his labor.

Buddy Hall (.909) overwhelmed Tony Davis (.738) 11-2 with an exemplary finish by breaking and running out the last three racks.

Joe Root (.793) upset David Howard (.782) 11-9 as both players displayed sub-par talent.

Bobby Johnson (.885) and Howard Vickery (.848) were the combatants in the tournament's most exciting "wire" match. At 10-10, with only the nine ball on the table and apparently no place to go, Johnson shot the cue ball rail first behind the nine pocketing it in the opposite side pocket for the win.

Just when you thought it was all over, David Howard (.856) leading 10-9, miscued on the seven ball! Dave Bollman (.868) won 11-10.

Efren Reyes (.871) defeated Wade Crane (.810) 11-5 by making the nine ball on the break to win the set. Crane didn't notice what happened, approached the table and proceeded to shoot the one ball.

After missing the combination, it didn't take long for reality to set in.

Dave Bollman (.889) ran out from the break six times en route to his 11-6 win over Bobby Johnson (.815).

In response to the 11-3 thrashing he received from Efren Reyes (.952), Joe Root (.787) said, "If he's making balls, you know he's out!" Reyes' .952 was the highest single TPA of the tournament.

Bob Williams (.942) wasted no time in his 11-1 victory over Tony Davis (.739). The match was the fastest of the tournament.

In the best played match by both players, Allen Hopkins (.941) broke and ran out six of the first seven racks! Dave Bollman (.897) won the next rack and then broke and ran out the next four racks! Hopkins finally won 11-7.

Earl Strickland (.899) edged Grady Mathews (.873) 11-10 in a well played match. Strickland came back from a 7-10 deficit to force a photo finish. At 10-10, Strickland failed to pocket a ball on the break and Mathews proceeded to run out - almost. After running seven balls, the cue ball stopped just close enough to the eight ball for Mathews to worry about a double kiss. That worry cost him the shot and match. Strickland won 11-10.

In the race to eleven match, Efren Reyes (.903) outpointed Kim Davenport (.775) by the score of 9-4! With the score 7-4, Davenport's poor position resulted in a missed bank shot and a new score, 8-4. The next rack, Davenport missed a shot badly and decided he had had enough. He raked in the balls conceding that rack, then shook Reyes' hand to concede the rest of the session.

The 1975 U.S. Open 9-Ball Championships will once again be held this year Nov. 1-10 at Q-Master Billiards in Norfolk, Virginia.

This year's tournament will have both men's and women's division sions with the women's division Nov. 1-3. The prize fund for the women will be \$8,500 with the winner receiving \$2,500. In the eight major tournaments played so far in 1985, 322 different players have competed and 128 players have won prize money. Last year 388 players competed and only 123 won prize money.

Dayton Open Postponed

The Dayton Open traditionally played at the end of the year has been postponed until January, 1986 and promises to be better. Tournament director Joe Kerr told Accu-Stats, "We're working to get a large corporate beer sponsor. The new event will have \$15-25,000 added and would be held at a convention type setting." The Dayton Open has always been a very successful tournament from both a player and spectator point of view.

Interesting Stats

The tournament drew a very strong field supported by its statistical results. The average TPA was .842, twenty-five points higher than normal.

The highest single TPA of the tournament was .952 posted by Efren Reyes in his routing of Joe Root. Reyes also racked up the highest TPA tournament average of .888. He was extremely consistent with

ten of his eleven matches having TPA's between .855 and .905.

What a break! Bob Williams ran out from the break 33% of the time and made a ball on the break 79% of the time ranking #1 in both categories.

Grady Mathews unfortunately scratched on the break an incredible 22% of the time, yet when he made a ball on the break without scratching, he ran out 60%, just as incredible.

Allen Hopkins (.887) played outstanding, yet was forced to withdraw from the tournament due to a death in his family. Our heartfelt sympathies go to Allen and his family.

Finals

Reyes defeated Strickland twice 11-9 in the finals for the \$4,650 first prize and trophy. In both final matches, Strickland lost while posting higher TPA's than Reyes. What caused this the first set was that although both players made about the same number of errors, Earl pocketed 95 balls while Efren pocketed only 79. Also, both players missed three balls apiece, two of Earl's costing him two racks. None of Efren's misses cost him a rack, in fact, after Reyes' three misses, Strickland was kicking.

In the final set, Reyes missed nine shots, the most missed in any of his sets, while Earl only missed four. How could Earl lose? Simply, after five of Efrens' misses, he eventually won the rack anyway and as we all know, good breaks, bad breaks, and stats don't win matches, nine balls do!
