

VIRGINIA BEACH - "The Rifleman" Buddy Hall opened fire on the 46 player field at the 1st Annual Gibbs Billiards 9-Ball Shootout and laid claim to the \$7,000 grand prize. In a manner befitting a champion, he posted a 6-0 record and this year's high TPA tournament average of .899. In races to eleven, Hall outdueled Brienza (9), White (4), Parica (3), Harris (1), Strickland (8), and Mathews (6).

Mathew's Charge Checked by Hall

Superb Event

Forty-six players arrived in Virginia Beach from all parts of the country to compete in the **lst Annual Gibbs Billiards 9-Ball Shootout** and share in the \$22,700 purse. Denton Gibbs, Jr. produced, sponsored, and hosted the major event and provided every amenity possible for both the players and spectators. Gibbs Billiards sweetened the pot by \$7,425 and stayed open 24 hours.

The event charged a \$325 entry fee, paid twenty-four places and provided excellent conditions. The tournament arena featured four Gold Crowns with bleachers running parallel. A restaurant was on the premises serving food and drink.

Mathews Strings Nine

Grady Mathews lost his first match and lost his last match, but strung nine victories in between! He defeated LeBron, Williams, Davenport, Vickery, Parica, Mizerak, Reid, Sigel, and Strickland. It looked like he was ready to take it all but it took a Buddy Hall to stop the fueled charge. This was Hall's first major win of '85 after finishing second in both Ohio and Atlantic City earlier this year. His .899 TPA is this year's highest recorded tournament average.

After winning the lag, Mathews scratched on the

NOTABLE MATCHES

Once again, as with each major tournament, we review the exciting matches worthy of note.

The number in parentheses is the player's TPA for that session.

Grady Mathews (.727) got off to a good start for after winning the lag, he broke and ran out the first two racks. David Howard (.908) then kept Mathews busy by serving up balls that Grady was forced to kick at. He defeated Mathews 11-3 and held him to pocketing just four more balls for the rest of the session. Note: Mathews proceeded to win the next nine sessions in a row!

While trailing 9-10, Mike LeBron (.841) made the nine ball on the break, but scratched. LeBron still won that rack and at 10-10, he made the nine ball on the break again, and scratched again! Jr. Harris (.802) won 11-10. Edgar White (.812) upended Steve Mizerak (.866) in an 11-10 photo finish. As White made his charge while behind 7-10, Mizerak missed one combination and one bank, but it was just enough.

Paul Brienza (.820) won his first "wire" match of the year over formidable Efren Reyes (.796). Brienza had previously lost all five of his sessions that were decided by one game.

Although he defeated Woody Woodhouse (.814) by an 11-5 margin, Bob Williams (.861) had the dubious distinction of scratching on the break four times in a row.

A poll was taken to find out what billiard cloth touring 9-ball professionals preferred. The question that was posed to each of the forty-six pros at the Gibbs Shootout was, "What billiard cloth would you prefer to play on in tournaments?" Simple enough, right? The responses were varied with comments praising several types and brands such as, "This cloth rolls more true.", or "This is the cloth that I am used to and most confident with.", or "This cloth is easier to jump balls with." After all was said and done, the consensus was twenty-five preferred Simonis while seventeen preferred other cloths of various brands and composition, and four did not respond at all.

The Gibbs Shootout produced fifteen .900's, fourteen "wire" matches, and no shutouts. Mike Sigel's .958 was the high TPA for a single session. Earl Strickland won the "Run Outs from the Break" category with 34.3%. David Howard ranked #1 in the "Ball on the Break" stat (80%), but who's surprised? Luther Lassiter never scratched on the break but for those with twenty or more break shots, Allen Hopkins had the most controlled break scratching only once in fifty-four breaks, 1.9% (9.4% was average). Paul Brienza made the nine ball on the break 13.6% of the time (2.4% was average).

first break. The next time he stepped to the table, Hall was ahead 3-0. After two more racks with nothing for Mathews to capitalize on, it spread to 5-0. At 9-6, Mathews scratched on the break again. It was to be his last chance for survival as Hall ran out and controlled the next rack with a safety and eventually won 11-6.

Even more incredible, Mike Gulyassy (.866) fell victim to Terry Bell (.859) 11-10 in a session in which Bell had the good fortune of making the nine on the break four times including the case game!

What a rack! Larry Lisciotti (.732) and Jimmy Reid (.901) volleyed for 21 turns during the session's last rack before Reid finally scored and won 11-4.

In the most notable of "notable matches", Dave Bollman (.800) and Rudolfo Luat (.863) were knotted at 3-3. After a Luat kick, Bollman ran out and then broke and ran out the next five racks which would stand as the tournament high run! Two racks later, Bollman led 10-4. Don't go away! While Bollman experienced several unforeseen events, Luat displayed some exceptional talent and copped the win 11-10.

After trailing 4-6, Grady Mathews (.953) exploded with outstanding play and held Kim Davenport (.776) to pocketing just one more ball for the rest of the session. Mathews won 11-6.

In the best played match by both players, Mike Sigel (.958) stung Allen Hopkins (.895) with the tournament high TPA for a single session. Sigel won 11-6.

Grady Mathews (.913) continued his winning ways by defeating Steve Mizerak (.793) after being down 4-6. Mathews won the next seven racks in which Mizerak missed only one ball.
