Varner Dethrones Sigel

DAVENPORT, IA (5/5-9/87) - Nick Varner and Jean Balukas reclaimed their titles of 1983, The McDermott Masters Championship. Nick Varner posted an 8-0 record thus preventing Mike Sigel from winning his fourth major title in a row. The race to eleven, double elimination event drew a hundred men and women players from across the nation building purses of \$33,000 and \$8,000 respectively. Varner won \$10,000 while Balukas cashed in \$2,000. In addition to the finals, there were many exciting matches, particularly Varner over Reyes 11-10, Mike Sigel's .988 TPA, and Dallas West's and Jimmy Hodges' .950 pluses.

Miller Time Billiards of Iowa hosted the PBA sanctioned event and stayed open 24 hours a day. Jim McDermott of McDermott Cue Mfg. and Steve Thoms of TPC Cash & Carry were the major sponsors adding

\$20,000 to the prize fund. Pat Fleming directed the event with Scott Smith.

The tournament arena housed six Gold Crown pool tables with bleacher seating on three sides. Of course, Accu-Stats was there with several cameras installed in the ceiling grids for reviewing matches. Accu-Stats was in the capable hands of Dennis McGimpsey of Moline.

Scott Kitto appears to be recovering quite well from a triple bypass heart operation. In fact, he defeated Wade Crane and Jimmy Reid in style, and averaged an .865 TPA for the tournament. In fact, he shot so well, there may be a run on triple bypass heart operations by pool players who don't need them. We sincerely wish him well.

Past winners of this event were Gary Nolan, Earl Strickland, Lori Shampo and Margaret Schmittau. See you next year.

Notable Matches

One of the earlier matches proved to be the match that exhibited the best play of the entire tournament. Mike Sigel (.988) shot a near perfect match defeating Chuck Absher (.474) 11-4. Sigel's only error during the match was a scratch on the break. At this time, .988 is the highest recorded Accu-Stats average for a race to eleven. Despite a high TPA, Sigel only made a ball on the break three times.

Takeshi Okumuro (.888), the finest player in Japan, played his debut match against veteran Howard Vickery (.759). Okumuro broke and ran out five of his eleven breaks to win 11-5. It was soon apparent that Okumuro can play!

Matt Mattille (.643) opened up his session indicating possibly that he knew something that no one else knew. He pocketed the nine ball on the break on his first two breaks. But from that point on, Jimmy Hodges (.957) dominated the session and never missed a ball. Final score: Hodges 11, Mattille 3. Incidentally, Hodges' .957 was not his high TPA of the tourney.

After trailing the entire match, Ken Cross (.778) finally closed the gap, although still trailing 6-7. His fatal mistake was a bad safety. Jim Wetch (.882) ran the next thirty-five balls to run out the set and win 11-6.

Paul Brienza (.841) opened up with a 3-0 lead but after failing to pocket a ball on the next break, he never had a chance. Jimmy Hodges (.973) ran out each of the eleven opportunities he had and won 11-3. Ironically, despite a .973 and a .957, Hodges finished out-of-the-money.

Buddy Hall (.974) broke and ran out five times and missed only one ball while defeating Willie Munson (.818), 11-4.

From the onset, Grady Mathews (.872) played catch-up with Ron Dobosenski (.872). Finally, Dobosenski missed a 9-ball bank shot allowing Mathews to pull ahead 8-7. Unfortunately, Mathews then scratched on the break. From that point on, he was only afforded the benefit of racking as Dobosenski ran out the set to win 11-8.

In a most heartbreaking match, Mark Wilson (.947) played a superb session of 9-ball. While on the hill at 10-6 against formidable Takeshi Okumuro (.893), Wilson was only afforded kicks and safeties. Okumuro was fortunate in that he kicked two balls in with reward and missed two shots without penalty. Final score: Okumuro 11, Wilson 10.

Bob Williams (.867) set an Accu-Stats record for pocketing the most balls on the break in one session. With his opponent Dick Spitzer (.862)





Balukas Upends Smith in Overtime

DAVENPORT, IA (5/7-9/87) - Je an Balukas, the pre-tournament winner of the favorite and previous eleven women events won The 4th McDermott Masters title and its \$2,000 first prize. This is a repeat performance for she shared Balukas for the winner's circle in 1983 with Nick Varner. This year, Balukas posted a 7-1 record defeating Bretenbach, Warren, Bonnie Hoffman, Glass, Miura, losing to Smith, and then defeating Smith for the title.

Twenty-seven WPBA members paid \$150 each to enter the race to nine, double elimination event, each trying to get as big a piece of the \$8,100 pie as possible. Laura Smith had to settle for the runner-up position while defeating

Balukas in the first of the two final matches. In fact, of the 179 sessions played in both divisions, the first session of the finals in the women's division, by far, had the most exciting finish of the entire tournament. (See Notable Matches.) The in-the-money listings follow:



Jim Rempe (.896) missed an easy shot while leading Kim Davenport (.917) 8-3. Rempe never pocketed another ball and lost 8-11.

Although leading 4-3 over Jim Rempe (.900), Earl Strickland (.872) only stroked the cue ball three more times to execute two safeties and one kick. Strickland lost 4-11.

After trailing 2-7 against Kim Davenport (.817), Mike Sigel (.909) finds his stroke and buries Davenport 11-7.

And last but certainly not least is the most exciting finish of any session in the tournament. In the race to nine finals, Jean Balukas is leading Laura Smith 8-5 and seems to be running out the last few balls to win the tournament, but misses an easy seven ball. Smith makes a fairly good run out to make the score 8-6. Smith then makes a ball on the break and is left long and straight on the one ball but plays the ball simply to make it. She then cuts the two ball in and accidentally pockets the nine ball on the same stroke bringing the score 8-7. Smith makes the 9-ball on the break. Score: 8-8. Smith makes the 9-ball on the break again to win 9-8.
