

Buddy Chalks Up Third Major Win of Year

Buddy Hall won the inaugural **Carolinas'** Cup backing up this year's previous major wins in Toledo and Denver. As a result, Mike LeBron is once again forced to wait his turn for that first major win which I'm sure will come soon. Tom Brown had his best finish of his professional career (3rd) defeating Jimmy Reid, Steve Mizerak, and Jim Rempe to name a few. Earl Strickland, as usual, played top notch but unfortunately confusion with his schedule resulted in a forfeited match thus eliminating him from the competition. Loree Jon Jones upended Mary Kenniston for the womens title. George and Irene Dowdy, owners of Mother's Billiard Parlor and Grille produced, hosted, and sponsored the major event, one which they had long planned. They added \$15,000 which drew fifty-eight men and women to Charlotte eager to share in over \$30,000 in prize money. A local Pepsi distributer donated \$500 for specialty events, \$100 a day for the winners of each contest. Johnny Morrow, Chuck Absher, and Chuck Abernathy each won one contest while David Howard won two.

Notable Matches

Harold Dollar (.882) played remarkably well, missing just two shots the entire session, less than anyone during the first day's play. Anyone that is, except for his opponent Jim Rempe (.939) who missed none! Although Dollar ran out each of his four opportunities, he lost 4-11.

Dave Bollman (.813) found just one of many ways to lose a hill-hill match. As he was running out the final rack, he scratched on the six ball giving Mike Gulyassy (.814) ball in hand to cinch the last four balls and the match 11-10. It was the first time during the entire session that Gulyassy was in the lead. easily shot a 1.000 had it not been for two carelessly missed shots and two scratches on the break. Other than that he ran out every time.

In a well played match, **Ray Martin** (.855) missed just one ball yet managed to only score five times. Hooking himself four times proved costly. It was just enough leeway for **Earl Strickland** (.897) to extend his lead to 11-5.

After Earl Strickland (.840) missed a kick shot while ahead 10-8, all he could do was watch as David Howard (.840) ran out the session to win 11-10.

Apparently, somebody was going to pay for an earlier defeat and the victim was Jack Romeo (.571). Earl Strickland (.942) rebounded from his Howard loss with an 11-0 drubbing. He could have






